DESCRIPTION:

The use of bows and arrows shooting at static targets.

This does not include field archery, which is not an approved activity by Bracknell Forest Council.

QUALIFICATIONS:

A minimum qualification of the GNAS (Grand National Archery Society) leader award.

STAFFING RATIO:

1 / 12

PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT:

Approved archery butts, safety netting behind archery butts, suitable area behind target area to allow for wild arrows to fall safely, finger protectors for bow draw hand, forearm protector for bow holding arm, chest protector if required.

HAZARDS:

Injury sustained from being hit by an arrow.

Injury sustained from walking into an arrow on the range.

Injury sustained as a result of drawing An arrow out of the butt incorrectly.

Abrasions to fingers on draw hand.

Abrasions to forearm of bow arm

GUIDANCE:

The activity should take place on a suitable range. If indoors there should be a suitable net in front of the back wall.

If outdoors there must be a suitable area beyond the safety netting.

All other recommendations regarding the range should be followed.
