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<p><u>DESCRIPTION:</u></p> <p>Horse riding and trekking</p>
<p><u>QUALIFICATIONS:</u></p> <p>The instructor in charge must have a minimum of the British Horse Society Assistant Instructor qualification or other nationally approved qualification</p>
<p><u>STAFFING RATIO:</u></p> <p>1 – 8</p>
<p><u>PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT:</u></p> <p>Hard shell head protection, shoes or boots with a heel so that the foot does not slip through the stirrup.</p>
<p><u>HAZARDS:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Falling off • Horse bolting or rearing • Road traffic and pedestrians • Other riders • Weather
<p><u>GUIDANCE:</u></p> <p>The activity should only take place at an establishment which has been approved by the British Horse Society or the Pony Club of Great Britain or other national registration scheme if abroad.</p>
